# MARK 15:6-15 TPT

<sup>6</sup> Every year at Passover, it was the custom of the governor to pardon a prisoner and release him to the people—anyone they wanted. <sup>7</sup> Now, Pilate was holding in custody a notorious criminal named Barabbas, one of the assassins who had committed murder in an uprising. <sup>8</sup> The crowds gathered in front of Pilate's judgment bench and asked him to release a prisoner to them, as was his custom. <sup>9</sup> So he asked them, "Do you want me to release to you the king of the Jews?" <sup>10</sup> (Pilate was fully aware that the religious leaders had handed Jesus over to him because of spite and envy.) <sup>11</sup> But the ruling priests stirred up the crowd to incite them to ask for Barabbas instead. <sup>12</sup> So Pilate asked them, "What do you want me to do with this one you call the king of the Jews?" <sup>13</sup> They all shouted back, "Crucify him!" <sup>14</sup> "Why?" Pilate asked. "What evil thing has he done wrong to deserve that?" But they kept shouting out with a deafening roar, "Crucify him at once!" <sup>15</sup> Because he wanted to please the people, Pilate released Barabbas to them. After he had Jesus severely beaten with a whip made of leather straps and embedded with metal, he sentenced him to be crucified."



# MARK 15:16-19 TPT

<sup>16</sup> The soldiers took Jesus into the headquarters of the governor's compound[g] and summoned a military unit of nearly six hundred men.<sup>17</sup> They placed a purple robe on him to make fun of him. Then they braided a victor's crown, a wreath made of thorns, and set it on his head. <sup>18</sup> And with a mock salute they repeatedly cried out, "Hail, your majesty, king of the Jews!" <sup>19</sup> They spit in his face and hit him repeatedly on his head with a reed staff, driving the crown of thorns deep into his brow. They knelt down before him in mockery, pretending to pay him homage.



# MARK 15:25-28 TPT

<sup>25</sup> It was nine o'clock in the morning when they finally crucified him. <sup>26</sup> Above his head they placed a sign with the inscription of the charge against him, which read, "This is the King of the Jews." <sup>27</sup> Two criminals were also crucified with Jesus, one on each side of him. <sup>28</sup> This fulfilled the Scripture that says: He was considered to be a criminal.



# MARK 15:31-34 TPT

<sup>31</sup> Even the ruling priests and the religious scholars joined in the mockery and kept laughing among themselves, saying, “He saved others, but he can’t even save himself! Israel’s king, is he?” <sup>32</sup> Let the ‘Messiah,’ the ‘king of Israel,’ pull out the nails and come down from the cross right now. We’ll believe it when we see it!” Even the two criminals who were crucified with Jesus began to taunt him, hurling insults on him. <sup>33</sup> For three hours, beginning at noon, darkness came over the earth. <sup>34</sup> About three o’clock, Jesus shouted with a mighty voice in Aramaic, “Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani?” - that is, “My God, My God, why have you turned your back on me?”



# MARK 15:37-39 TPT

<sup>37</sup> Just then Jesus passionately cried out with a loud voice and breathed his last. <sup>38</sup> At that moment the veil in the Holy of Holies was torn in two from the top to the bottom.

<sup>39</sup> When the Roman military officer who was standing right in front of Jesus saw how he died, he said, "There is no doubt this man was the Son of God!"



# ROMANS 5:6-8 NIV

<sup>6</sup> You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. <sup>7</sup> Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous person, though for a good person someone might possibly dare to die. <sup>8</sup> But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.
